

Instructor: Karenza Denson, Forensic Technician

Karenza Denson is a 2016 graduate of the University of Southern Mississippi with a Bachelor' Degree in Forensic Science and Technology with emphasis in Criminal Justice.

Prior to moving to Texas, Karenza worked as an Intern with the Crime Scene Unit at the Hattiesburg Police Department in Mississippi followed by four years as a full-time Forensic Technician in Crime Scene Investigation with the Gulfport Police Department. During her time with Gulfport Police Department, Karenza not only had the opportunity to work numerous crime scene investigation; she also had the opportunity to train department personnel on evidence collection techniques, fingerprint processing, and crime scene documentation.

In 2020, Karenza relocated to Texas and accepted employment with the Houston Forensic Science Center as a Crime Scene Investigator. She performed scene divine, evidence collection and processing as well as crime scene photography and documentation.

Currently and for the last 2 years, Karenza has been employed with KIPP: Northeast College Preparatory in Houston Texas as a Forensic Science and Criminal Investigations teacher. Karenza teaches crime scene documentation, scene security, crime scene photography, evidence collection, chain of custody, sketching and measuring, fingerprint processing, as well as facilitating labs.
