About the Instructor: Karenza Denson

Karenza Denson is a 2016 graduate of the University of Southern Mississippi, where she earned a Bachelor's degree in Forensic Science and Technology with an emphasis in Criminal Justice.

Before relocating to Texas, Karenza began her forensic career as an intern with the Crime Scene Unit at the Hattiesburg Police Department in Mississippi. She later served for four years as a full-time Forensic Technician in Crime Scene Investigation with the Gulfport Police Department. During her tenure with Gulfport PD, Karenza worked a wide range of crime scenes and also trained department personnel in evidence collection techniques, fingerprint processing, and crime scene documentation.

In 2020, Karenza moved to Texas and joined the Houston Forensic Science Center as a Crime Scene Investigator. In that role, she conducted scene processing, evidence collection and processing, as well as crime scene photography and documentation.

For the past five years, Karenza has served as a Forensic Science and Criminal Investigations teacher at KIPP Northeast College Preparatory in Houston, Texas. In this position, she teaches crime scene documentation, scene security, crime scene photography, evidence collection, chain of custody, sketching and measuring, fingerprint processing, and practical forensic science lab exercises.

Karenza also has courtroom testimony experience and has continued to expand her forensic expertise through specialized training. Her continuing education includes Crime Scene Photography through the Mississippi Division of the FBI, Intermediate Level Latent Print Comparison through Texas Forensic Associates, National Integrated Ballistic Information Network (NIBIN) Data Acquisition certification through the ATF, and Investigation and Reconstruction of Shooting Incidents through Texas Forensic Associates.

She is a member of the International Association for Identification and the Texas Association for Identification. Karenza also holds the TCOLE Basic Instructor Proficiency Certification.
